| 1 | The AEI-CASC Engineering Scholarship | Three \$500 scholarships will be awarded to outstanding graduating seniors who intend to pursue a degree in Engineering at a four-year college or university. Students pursuing any Engineering degree are eligible, preference will be given to qualified students entering a program in Civil or Environmental Engineering. Students must have a minimum 3.0 GPA, demonstrate an interest in an Engineering career and be involved in community service and/or extracurricular activities. |
| 2 | The Patty Ahearn-Victoria Elementary School | This \$500 scholarship may be awarded to a graduating senior from any Redlands Unified high school who has a 2.5 GPA or higher. This student must have attended Victoria Elementary School for at least three years and has continued to follow the Victoria Peace Builder's Pledge. |
| 3 | American Business Women's Association | A \$500 or greater scholarship will be awarded to a graduating female senior seeking a business or professional career. Selection is based on scholastic standing and financial need. |
| 4 | American Legion Post #106 | This \$500 scholarship will be awarded to an outstanding student with a goal to continue his or her education at a two-year or four-year college or a vocational training facility. The recipient should be related to a veteran. The student should provide the name of said veteran and the branch of military service he or she was in. Applicants should include this information using one of the specific essays (RCSF web pages 28 through 34) and title it: AMERICAN LEGION POST #106. |
| 5 | Frank G. Araujo Memorial | Four scholarships of \$500 will be awarded to students of Mexican-American descent. The recipients must have a 3.0 or higher GPA, demonstrate good citizenship, and participate in school or community activities. |
| 6 | Connie "Chelo" Armendariz Memorial | This \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior planning to continue his/her education at a vocational school, junior college, or university. Preference shall be given to a student who attended the former Saint Mary's Catholic Church in Redlands. Applicants must indicate the years they attended this church. Applicants should include this information using one of the specific essays (RCSF web pages 28 through 34) and title it: CONNIE ARMENDARIZ MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP. |
| 7 | Arroyo Verde Elementary School PTA | Two \$500 scholarships may be awarded to a graduating senior who attended Arroyo Verde Elementary School. The recipient must have a minimum 3.25 GPA if attending a four-year college or a minimum 2.5 GPA if attending a community college or vocational-technical school. The recipient must have also demonstrated good character and citizenship during his or her high school career. |

| 8 | Beattie Middle School PTA | This \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a student who attended Beattie Middle School, has a 2.5 GPA or higher, and demonstrates good citizenship. Consideration will also be based on the student/family participation in PTA/PTSA membership and activities. |
| 9 | Beaver Medical Clinic Foundation - Premedical Award | One \$4,000 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who is seeking a career in the field of medicine. The student must be outstanding both academically and in leadership skills, ensuring success in his or her planned career. |
| 10 | Raymond and Donald Beeler Memorial | A \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a student with at least a 3.0 GPA. Financial need is a consideration. The scholarship will be awarded to a student who will attend a community or a four-year college on a full-time basis. |
| 11 | Benchwarmers Club of Redlands - Paul Duralia | This \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a three-year member of the Citrus Valley High School football team who has been a starter for at least one year, exhibited good citizenship and dedication, and has an eligible GPA. |
| 12 | Barbara Bonnema Memorial | Several \$500 or greater scholarships may be awarded to students who show academic excellence as well as a financial need. The students must also be college-bound graduating seniors who will be attending school on a full-time basis. |
| 13 | Boy Scouts of America Troop 3 Art Till/Nathan E. Smith Memorial | Two \$500 scholarships will be awarded to graduating seniors with a minimum 3.0 GPA who plan to attend an accredited college, university, or vocational program. Continued involvement in scouting and community service will be considered. Preference will be given to individuals who have attained the rank of Eagle Scout. |
| 14 | Quincy Brown Memorial | A scholarship of \$500 or greater will be awarded to a graduating senior who will enroll as a full-time student in a four-year college or university pursuing a business or teaching career. The student must have a 3.0 or higher GPA and have attended a Redlands Unified School District school for three consecutive years. |
| 15 | Kathy Bush Memorial | A \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who has been outstanding in the field of instrumental music. |
| 16 | Cesar E. Chavez Memorial | This \$750 scholarship celebrates Cesar E. Chavez's legacy of compassion, education and equality for all Americans. It will awarded to a graduating senior who has shown exemplary leadership, given community service, and shows financial need. Please write a short essay explaining how you exemplify his spirit and how you intend to further honor it. Applicants should include this information using one of the specific essays (RCSF web pages 28 through 34) and title it: CESAR E. CHAVEZ MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP |

| 17 | Citrus Valley High School PTSA | These \$500 scholarships will be awarded to graduating seniors of CVHS. The students must have a minimum 2.5 GPA and be a member of CVHS PTSA. Include a one-page essay describing your participation in PTA/PTSA activities throughout your school years. Applicants should include this information using one of the specific essays (RCSF web pages 28 through 34) and title it: CVHS PTSA |
| 18 | Citrus Valley Social Studies Department | This \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a qualified student who has a 3.0 GPA, has maintained a B or higher in high school social studies classes and has accumulated 20 hours of community service. Student must demonstrate good attendance, have a clean discipline record, and have involvement in at least one extracurricular activity. Please write a one-page essay describing how your interest in social studies will pertain to your future studies. Applicants should include this information using one of the specific essays (RCSF web pages 28 through 34) and title it: CITRUS VALLEY SOCIAL STUDIES |
| 19 | Clement Middle School PTA | This \$300 scholarship may be awarded to a graduating senior who attended and was involved in school activities at Clement Middle School. |
| 20 | J. and M. Cole | This \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who has demonstrated good citizenship and is active in a local group such as a church or a community service organization. Must have a minimum GPA of 2.5 and be attending college full-time. Students of an employed single parent and with financial need are given first consideration. |
| 21 | Contemporary Club | A \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who will continue to further his or her education in a career of his or her choice. |
| 22 | Crafton Elementary School PTA | A \$500 scholarship will be given to a graduating senior from REV, RHS or CVHS who has a financial need and has demonstrated outstanding community service through his or her high school years. The student must have attended Crafton Elementary School. |
| 23 | Cram Elementary School PTA | These \$300 scholarships may be awarded to a graduating senior who attended Cram Elementary School for at least two years and has a 3.0 GPA or better. One scholarship is for a student going to a four-year college and another scholarship is for a student going to a two-year college. |
| 24 | Arthur H. Daniels Memorial | A scholarship of \$500 will be awarded to a graduating senior for citizenship, academic accomplishment, contribution to school and community, and future career plans. This scholarship will be granted to a college-bound student who plans to attend on a full-time basis. |
| 25 | Franklin Elementary School PTA | This \$300 scholarship may be awarded to a student who attended Franklin Elementary School and has extensive volunteer service in both school and community. Academic standing and financial need will be taken into consideration. |
| 26 | Gail Garner Memorial R.I.S.E. | A scholarship of \$500 will be awarded to a student graduating through the Redlands Independent Study Education (R.I.S.E.) program from RHS, REV, CVHS, or OHS. |

| 27 | Bill Gibson Memorial | This \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who has a 3.0 GPA or higher and plans to attend a college, university, or vocational school on a full-time basis. |
| 28 | Ann and Brad Glassco | This \$500 scholarship is to be awarded to a student who has spent significant time during his/her high school years perfecting unusual skills that are outside of his/her high school interests. He/she must have been recognized for their accomplishments (i.e. Brandenberger Award at the Great Y Circus, state championship rider, Junior Olympic diver, professional performer.) The student must have a 2.5 GPA or better. |
| 29 | Rachel Graham Memorial | Several scholarships at \$500 each will be awarded to graduating seniors who will attend a four-year college or university on a full-time basis. They must have maintained at least a 3.0 GPA, shown good citizenship and participated in school and community activities. |
| 30 | Robert J. Hodges CVHS Coaches Award | This \$1,000 scholarship is to support a male or female student athlete whose positive attitude, respect for others, honorable competitive spirit and sense of team were key to the overall success of an athletic program. Candidates must have a minimum GPA of 2.5 and plan to attend a two or four-year college or university. |
| 31 | Junior Women of the Contemporary Club | This \$300 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who has demonstrated outstanding community service in countless areas during his/her high school years. |
| 32 | Annette and Ernest Keith Memorial | A \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who is in the top ten percent (10%) of his or her class and will be attending a four-year California college or university on a full-time basis. |
| 33 | Kimberly Elementary School PTA | This \$300 scholarship may be awarded to a graduating senior who attended Kimberly Elementary School for a minimum of three years, is an average or above-average achiever, demonstrates good citizenship, and preferably has not received other scholarships. |
| 34 | Friends and Family of Christopher J. Kohlmeier | This \$750 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who plans to attend a two-year or four-year college or university and who has strong test scores, but whose C average in high school could easily have been higher. Preference will be given to a student interested in a career in law enforcement or firefighting. |
| 35 | Doreen Legg Memorial | This scholarship of \$500 will be awarded to a graduating senior who will enroll full-time at a four-year college or university pursuing a business or teaching career. The recipient must have a minimum 3.0 GPA and attended a RUSD High School for three consecutive years. |
| 36 | Jack A. and Louise S. Levine Memorial | A \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who plans to continue his or her education, has a 3.0 or higher GPA, demonstrates good citizenship, and has participated in school and/or community activities. |

| 37 | Lugonia Alumni/Harrison Lightfoot | Several \$1000 scholarships will be awarded to graduating seniors who attended Lugonia Elementary School. The students must have extensive community service and/or be involved in school activities, demonstrate good citizenship, and have a GPA of 2.5 or higher. The scholarship may be used at any college, university, or vocational school. |
| 38 | Henry Llamas Memorial | This \$500 scholarship is offered to a student involved in cross-country and/or track who has a 3.0 or great GPA and who plans to attend a two-year or four-year college or university on a full-time basis. |
| 39 | Owen Locke Memorial | These scholarships are available to students with a 3.0 GPA or above and who demonstrate financial need. Please note you may not have applied for other Owen Locke scholarships offered by an organization other than the RCSF. |
| 40 | Mariposa Elementary School PTA | This \$500 scholarship may be awarded to a graduating senior who attended Mariposa Elementary School for at least two years. The recipient must have demonstrated serious scholarship, good citizenship, and a desire for further education either in academics or a vocational trade. |
| 41 | Moore Middle School PTA | This \$300 scholarship may be awarded to a graduating senior who attended Moore Middle School for three years and plans to attend college or a trade school. |
| 42 | Rick Munoz Memorial | This \$500 scholarship is presented in memory of Rick Munoz. The recipient must have lettered in at least one sport in his or her senior year, as well as demonstrated high academic achievement, outstanding citizenship, and a desire to continue his or her education. |
| 43 | Northside Booster Club - Felix R. Sepulveda Memorial | The Northside Booster Club has established these \$500 scholarships to encourage athletes to maintain a good academic average. The scholarships will be awarded to a graduating male and female who have maintained at least a 2.5 GPA and participated in at least one sport. |
| 44 | Optimist Club of Redlands - Duncan | A \$1,500 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior girl who has a minimum 3.0 GPA, has a positive attitude, and has been involved in service to the community. |
| 45 | Optimist Club of Redlands - Duralia | This \$1,500 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior boy who has a minimum 3.0 GPA, a positive attitude, and involvement in service to the community. |
| 46 | PCH Architects LLP - Steven J. Lehnhof Memorial Architectural | A \$500 scholarship is presented in memory of Steven J. Lehnhof, an architecture and drafting teacher at Redlands High School for many years. It will be awarded to a graduating senior who will be majoring in architecture or architectural engineering at an accredited college or university. |

| 47 | The PoWeR To Continue Learning | This \$500 scholarship, offered by the Professional Women of Redlands, will be awarded to a graduating young woman who possesses a minimum 2.5 GPA, has participated in at least one school activity, and has demonstrated some type of community service. The recipient must be planning to attend a two-year or four-year college, or a vocational program. Preference will be given to a student who will be the first in her family to obtain a college degree or professional-level training. A short essay must be attached on the topic, Why I Want to Continue My Education. Applicants should include this information using one of the specific essays (RCSF web pages 28 through 34) and title it: THE POWER TO CONTINUE LEARNING. |
| 48 | Redlands Administrative Personnel Association | Scholarships of \$500 or more will be awarded to the sons and daughters of members of RAPA. A screening committee composed of RAPA members will meet to determine the most deserving applicant, based on an objective scoring system. |
| 49 | Redlands Area Interfaith Council | This \$300 scholarship was created from the long history of promoting love and respect among all of the people of faith in our community. The student must provide a one-page essay using the following prompt: How I Can Be an Agent of Peace. Applicants should include this information using one of the specific essays (RCSF web pages 28 through 34) and title it: REDLANDS AREA INTERFAITH COUNCIL SCHOLARSHIP. |
| 50 | Redlands Baseball/Softball for Youth | This \$350 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who has participated in the Redlands Baseball/Softball for Youth program, including scorekeepers or umpires, for a minimum of three years. The student must have exemplified good sportsmanship and academic achievement. Please include a 200 word essay entitled How Redlands Baseball/Softball for Youth Has Impacted My Life. Indicate how many years and in what capacity you participated, i.e.: Player, Umpire, Scorekeeper. Applicants should include this information using one of the specific essays (RCSF web pages 28 through 34) and title it: REDLANDS BASEBALL - SOFTBALL FOR YOUTH. |
| 51 | Redlands Community Hospital Auxiliary | This \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who will attend a college or university and major in some type of allied-health program. The recipient must be a Redlands Community Hospital junior volunteer and must complete 100 hours of volunteer service by the end of the school year. |
| 52 | Redlands Council PTA - Dorathy Jolley Memorial | This \$300 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who has a minimum 3.0 GPA and is active in a non-school service group such as church, scouts, or a community service club. |
| 53 | Redlands Community Scholarship Foundation - Honoring Ed Gleitsman | A \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior to assist in his or her pursuit of higher education in a business field. |

The student must present an essay in 100 words or less using the following prompt: What Education Means to Me. Applicants should include this information using one of the specific essays (RCSF web pages 28 through 34) and title it: REDLANDS EDUCATIONAL SUPORT PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP. |
| 56 | Redlands Evening Lions Club - Barbara Westen Memorial | This \$350 scholarship will be awarded to help a deserving graduate pursue his or her training beyond high school. First preference is given to a student with a hearing or sight disability, in which case the amount will double to \$700. If no recipient meets these criteria, the recipient must have scholastic ability. Financial need is also considered.
