#	NAME	DESCRIPTION
1	The Patty Ahearn-Victoria Elementary School	This \$500 scholarship may be awarded to a graduating senior from any Redlands Unified high school who has a 2.5 GPA or higher. This student must have attended Victoria Elementary School for at least three years and has continued to follow the Victoria Peace Builder's Pledge.
2	American Business Women's Association	A \$500 or greater scholarship will be awarded to a graduating female senior seeking a business or professional career. Selection is based on scholastic standing and financial need.
3	American Legion Post #106	This \$500 scholarship will be awarded to an outstanding student with a goal to continue his or her education at a two-year or four-year college or a vocational training facility. The recipient should be related to a veteran. The student should provide the name of said veteran and the branch of military service he or she was in. Applicants should include this information using one of the specific essays (RCSF web pages 28 through 34) and title it: AMERICAN LEGION POST #106.
4	Ammannito Family	This \$300 scholarship will be awarded to an outstanding student who makes a special contribution to the We Care Program at Orangewood High School. This scholarship is given in memory of Theresa Philler, the original head of this program.
5	Baha'i Faith Scholarship for Racial Harmony	This \$250 scholarship may be awarded to a graduating senior who has promoted racial and intercultural harmony on campus. Please attach a short statement showing how you have met this requirement. Applicants should include this information using one of the specific essays (RCSF web pages 28 through 34) and title it: BAHAI FAITH SCHOLARSHIP FOR RACIAL HARMONY.
6	Beaver Medical Clinic Foundation - Orangewood	A \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who will pursue studies in the medical field.
7	Robert Campbell Memorial	This scholarship is awarded to an outstanding student who is highly motivated, and plans to attend either a junior college or a vocational school for the LVN program or a post-secondary institution.
8	Cesar E. Chavez Memorial	This \$750 scholarship celebrates Cesar E. Chavez's legacy of compassion, education and equality for all Americans. It will awarded to a graduating senior who has shown exemplary leadership, given community service, and shows financial need. Please write a short essay explaining how you exemplify his spirit and how you intend to further honor it. Applicants should include this information using one of the specific essays (RCSF web pages 28 through 34) and title it: CESAR E. CHAVEZ MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

9	Contemporary Club	A \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who will continue to further his or her education in a career of his or her choice.
10	Cope Middle School PTSA	This \$300 scholarship may be awarded to a graduating senior who attended Cope Middle School for a minimum of two years. Citizenship and a desire to continue his/her education after high school are also a requirement. Priority will be given to a student whose parents were PTA volunteers.
11	Mary Doyle Memorial	This scholarship will be awarded to an outstanding student who has a positive attitude and wishes to continue his or her education at a two or four-year college.
12	Gail Garner Memorial R.I.S.E.	A scholarship of \$500 will be awarded to a student graduating through the Redlands Independent Study Education (R.I.S.E.) program from RHS, REV, CVHS, or OHS.
13	William T. Hartzell Memorial	This \$500 scholarship will be awarded to an outstanding student to assist him or her to obtain further education. It must be used at either a two or four-year college, any kind of trade school or any other form of education that will help the recipient make a contribution to society. Attendance must be either full or part-time. Preference will be given to a student who has participated in school or community activities. This scholarship is in memory of William T. Hartzell, a lifetime resident of Redlands who was very active in community affairs.
14	Lugonia Alumni/Harrison Lightfoot	Several \$1000 scholarships will be awarded to graduating seniors who attended Lugonia Elementary School. The students must have extensive community service and/or be involved in school activities, demonstrate good citizenship, and have a GPA of 2.5 or higher. The scholarship may be used at any college, university, or vocational school.
15	Owen Locke Memorial	These scholarships are available to students with a 3.0 GPA or above and who demonstrate financial need. Please note you may not have applied for other Owen Locke scholarships offered by an organization other than the RCSF.
16	John Miller Memorial	This scholarship will be awarded to an outstanding student who has a positive attitude and wishes to continue their education at a two or four-year college.
17	Optimist Club of Redlands Foundation	A \$500 scholarship will be awarded to an outstanding student who has a positive attitude and has been involvement in service to the community.
18	James Halsey Pearce Memorial Scholarship	This \$300 scholarship is offered to a special education student continuing on to college. The recipient must have special needs in high school. A short statement explaining the special circumstances of the recipient must be attached. Applicants should include this information using one of the specific essays (RCSF web pages 28 through 34) and title it: JAMES HALSEY PEARCE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP.

19	The PoWeR To Continue Learning	This \$500 scholarship, offered by the Professional Women of Redlands, will be awarded to a graduating young woman who possesses a minimum 2.5 GPA, has participated in at least one school activity, and has demonstrated some type of community service. The recipient must be planning to attend a two-year or four-year college, or a vocational program. Preference will be given to a student who will be the first in her family to obtain a college degree or professional-level training. A short essay must be attached on the topic, Why I Want to Continue My Education. Applicants should include this information using one of the specific essays (RCSF web pages 28 through 34) and title it: THE POWER TO CONTINUE LEARNING.
20	Redlands Baseball/Softball for Youth	This \$350 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who has participated in the Redlands Baseball/Softball for Youth program, including scorekeepers or umpires, for a minimum of three years. The student must have exemplified good sportsmanship and academic achievement. Please include a 200 word essay entitled How Redlands Baseball/Softball for Youth Has Impacted My Life. Indicate how many years and in what capacity you participated, i.e.: Player, Umpire, Scorekeeper. Applicants should include this information using one of the specific essays (RCSF web pages 28 through 34) and title it: REDLANDS BASEBALL - SOFTBALL FOR YOUTH.
21	Redlands Council PTA - Dorothy Jolley Memorial	This \$300 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who has a minimum 3.0 GPA and is active in a non-school service group such as church, scouts, or a community service club.
22	Redlands Education Support Professionals Association	A \$1000 or greater scholarship will be awarded to the most deserving student within the Redlands Unified School District. The student must have a 2.5 or higher GPA, be the son or daughter of a RESPA member, and wish to attend an institution of higher learning. The student must present an essay in 100 words or less using the following prompt: What Education Means to Me. Applicants should include this information using one of the specific essays (RCSF web pages 28 through 34) and title it: REDLANDS EDUCATIONAL SUPORT PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP.
23	Redlands Evening Lions Club - Barbara Westen Memorial	This \$350 scholarship will be awarded to help a deserving graduate pursue his or her training beyond high school. First preference is given to a student with a hearing or sight disability, in which case the amount will double to \$700. If no recipient meets these criteria, the recipient must have scholastic ability. Financial need is also considered. Applicants should include this information using one of the specific essays (RCSF web pages 28 through 34) and title it: REDLANDS EVENING LIONS CLUB SCHOLARSHIP.

24	Redlands Kiwanis Challenge Grants	This \$1250 scholarship will be awarded to a student who has met or overcome challenges or obstacles to earn a high school diploma. This success is evidenced by a significant improvement in academic achievement, attendance, effort and service to others in school and community. Applicants should include this information "How I Have Overcome Obstacles In My Life" using one of the specific essays (RCSF web pages 28 through 34) and title it: REDLANDS KIWANIS CHALLENGE GRANT
25	Redlands Rotary Club Foundation Discretionary	Two \$500 scholarships will be awarded to an outstanding student who intends to pursue higher education at a two-year or four-year college.
26	Redlands Sunrise Rotary Club	This \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who has a minimum 3.0 GPA or better, has been active in school and community, and has demonstrated outstanding citizenship. The recipient must plan to be enrolled in college.
27	Redlands Teachers Association	Several \$500 scholarships may be awarded to graduating seniors who are committed to the profession of teaching. Recipients must be in good standing scholastically and have good citizenship. Qualified children with R.T.A. affiliations will be considered first.
28	Albert Ruiz Memorial	This \$300 scholarship is awarded to an outstanding student who displays good citizenship, as well as pride in their school and the community.
29	Soroptimist International of Redlands	A \$750 will be awarded to an outstanding student who has participated in community service and who will be attending an accredited college, university, community college or trade school on a full-time or part-time basis and plans on majoring in one of the following: health care, law, engineering, computer science, education, retail service and/or business administration.
30	Patricia Wirz Memorial	This scholarship is awarded to an outstanding student who wishes to continue their education at a two or four-year college. This scholarship is offered by Gayle Wirz, a former Orangewood High School teacher, in honor of his wife Pat Wirz.
